

DISLEY FOOTPATHS SOCIETY

The main objective of the Society is to help to ensure that the footpaths in the Parish of Disley are free from obstruction, adequately signed and well maintained.

The Society also recommends the creation of new footpaths where appropriate.

Although completely independent, the Society works closely with Cheshire East Council, which is the Public Rights of Way Authority, Disley Parish Council, and the Canal & River Trust.

A Committee of up to ten members is elected annually.

Activities

Many members join to show their support for the aims of the Society but some may volunteer to help in the following tasks:

- Monitoring and reporting on the state of footpaths. Members 'adopt' and report on a footpath, or footpaths, once a year.
- Assisting with light clearance work, such as overgrowing vegetation, etc.

Tools are provided and training given for all work and members are also covered by Cheshire East Council insurance.

Meetings, walks, social activities

There are two general meetings in the year, usually with guest speakers. A programme of walks is arranged for the summer months culminating in a walk around the Parish boundary.

Membership

Membership is open to all who are concerned that our heritage of public footpaths in Disley is maintained.

The Society's year runs from September to August and the annual subscription is £3.

A regular newsletter with information about forthcoming events is circulated to members.
