2296	Public Forum  Nine members of the public were in attendance, several of whom addressed the meeting.  One resident expressed concern about the lack of signage in the Community Centre / Library car park about keeping dogs under control and on a lead at all times in the car park area. This resulted from an attack on his small dog by a German Shepherd dog which was off its lead on Christmas Day. The resident reported the incident to Cheshire Police (via 101), the Disley PCSO and has emailed the Warden Service at Cheshire East Council (CEC). He would like the council to consider placing signage at the 3 entrances to the car park. Cllr. Patfison expressed sympathy that the incident had occurred and enquired about the well being of the dog. She informed the resident that Disley Parish Council (DPC) has no jurisdiction in this matter as the car park is owned by CEC. She agreed to write to CEC on the resident's behalf for some advice about whether signage is possible. She said that DPC would keep in touch with the resident but mentioned that it may be a month or so before we receive a response from CEC.  The remaining members of the public attended to express their concerns about Greystones Allotment site which was agenda item number 9. Cllr. Pattison asked if it would be helpful for her to read out a statement setting out the background to this matter and this is summarised as follows:  The site was put forward by DPC as a possible site to fulfil the outstanding 20 dwellings that were required to complete the 243 dwellings to be provided in Disley to 2030 and to fulfil the requirement of the Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr. Pattison said her understanding is that the CEC Local Plan is unlikely to be approved until Summer 2020 at which point Disley may find that no further dwellings are needed. However, should the site be brought forward for development, DPC would need:  1) planning application may be part of a larger strategic plan to carry out

tree planting and possible re-wilding of the site and a community orchard as part of DPC investment in Newtown.

- 2) DPC would need approval from the Secretary of State to relocate the existing allotment site.
- 3) DPC would then need to apply for planning permission on the existing allotment site.
- 4) DPC would have to build / develop the new allotments and undertake the relocation and it would only be at that stage that DPC would be able to consider progressing any development.

In the circumstances, Cllr. Pattison stated that if any development was required, it would be unlikely to commence for at least 5-6 years. Cllr. Pattison also stated that she had personally delivered the briefing statement about this matter to 125 homes near to the allotments and the statement is also on the Parish Council website.

A resident asked if DPC would be prepared to hold a meeting about this issue with residents who weren't able to attend the council meeting. Cllr. Pattison said we could hold a meeting but, as outlined earlier, felt that any developments would be a long time away. The resident also asked if we had an update on the Air Quality Survey in the Greystones area. Cllr. Pattison stated that Newtown isn't an air quality survey area and suggested that this be taken up with Cllr. Murphy or formally via DPC who would forward it to Cllr. Murphy. The resident also stated that if the allotments were moved to Newtown Playing Fields, access to the site would be very poor. Cllr. Pattison noted that this would form part of any planning application.

Another resident expressed concern that access to any development on Greystones allotment site would be from the A6 and asked how DPC could be sure that this will be satisfactory. Cllr. Pattison said that it was CE Highways who suggested access onto the A6, confirmed that access would not go through Peveril Gardens and stated that DPC would not sell the land without planning permission.

Another resident informed the council that she thought the Disley & Newtown Allotment Association should be involved in any major decisions about allotment sites and questioned how DPC could "go over the allotment holders' heads" and why the association can't run the allotments. She also queried how it could be in the best interests of the village to have more houses and air quality problems. Cllr. Pattison replied that the association was involved in a consultation in 2017 and confirmed that the allotments are owned and managed by the Parish Council. She said that Woods solicitors had looked at the deeds and provided input to the recent briefing statement. The resident asked to look at the deeds to check that the allotments are owned by the Parish Council and not held in trust and would also like to see a map of all Parish Council owned land. There was a short discussion about how the proceeds of any allotment sale would be used. Cllr. Pattison agreed that the deeds and map can be made available. Cllr. Pattison stated that nothing will happen until the

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	CEC Local Plan is agreed, say, by September 2020. Cllr. Adams added that it may be that no more dwellings are required in Disley as the number has already reduced from the original 243 to only 13 and this may be achieved across the village over the next 3-4 years. At that time, DPC will wait to see what's being built in the village and will start on the larger strategic plan.  A resident asked if DPC would move the existing trees from Greystones to a new allotment site if necessary which Cllr. Pattison agreed. Cllr. Mr Birchall added that DPC intends to plant 2020 trees for 2020 (including some Christmas trees which could be used / sold in future years) which may help to remove some air pollution.  The meeting was also attended by John Irwin, Chairman of the National Allotment Society (NAS) who stated that he was pleased to hear Cllr. Pattison's summary of the situation. He encouraged councillors to consult with the NAS in the future as they would be happy to provide any guidance / advice to DPC, including details of any available grants.
