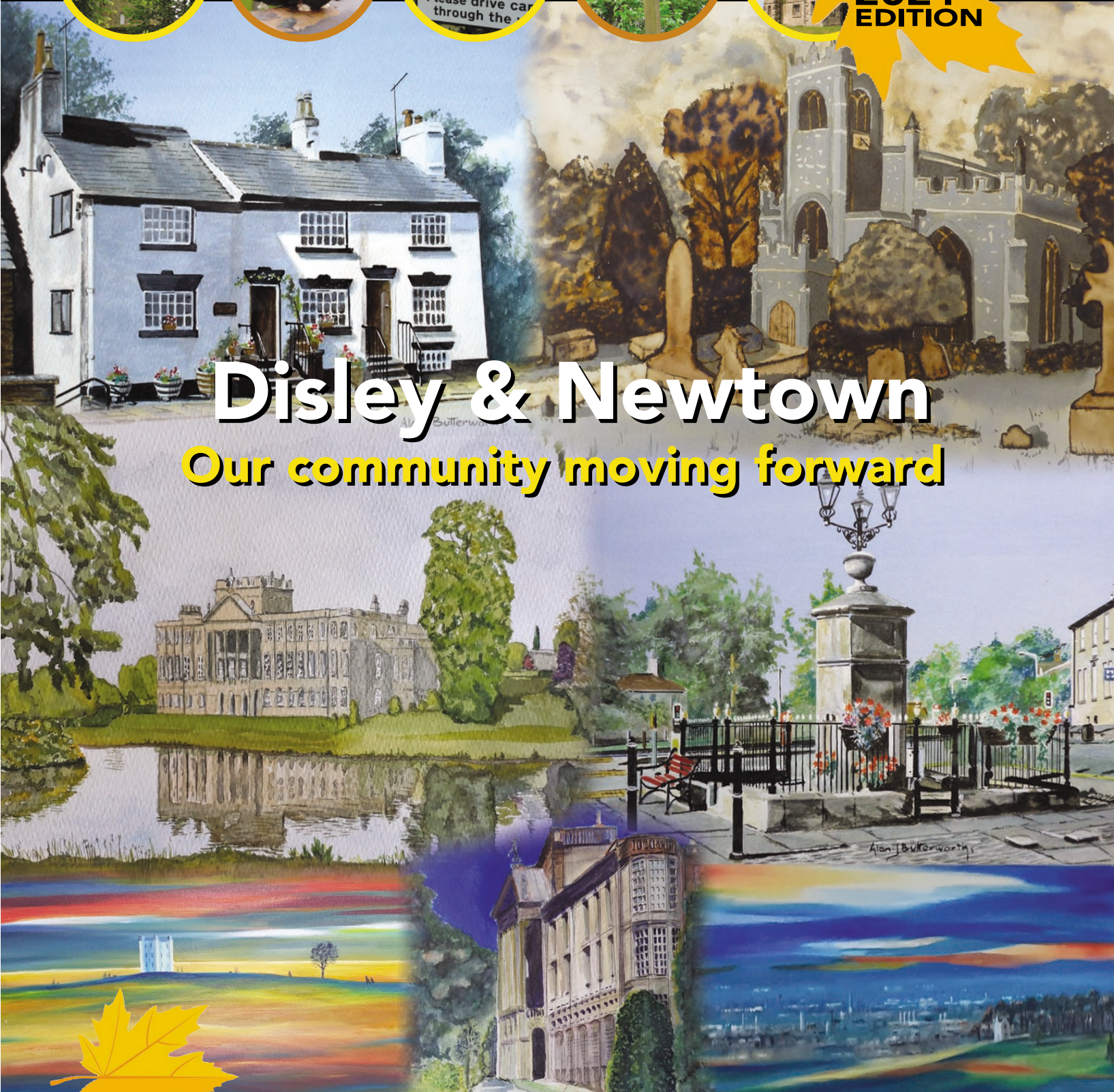

Allot better



Only two years ago Greystones Allotments in Newtown were looking a bit uncared for and had even been suggested as a possible site for housing development. Now, all the plots are fully let and some that have been abandoned for years are being brought back into cultivation. Greystones is setting an example of how a well-operated allotment site should look and it's a tribute and a credit to all the gardeners there.

Gardeners at all allotment sites - Springfield and Hagg Bank, as well as Greystones - are reporting bumper crops of broad beans, onions and soft fruits this year with potatoes looking good too. This is despite the strange weather patterns that they are now having to cope with.

On Saturday 4th September 2021, local allotment gardeners will be holding a fundraising coffee morning at Disley Community Centre where some of this year's harvest will be on sale, as well as plenty of other goodies.

Disley & District PROBUS

Disley & District PROBUS is an informal group of retired and semi-retired gentlemen who meet on a regular basis for convivial fellowship and the opportunity to learn about a diverse range of subjects.



During COVID, regular meetings were held on-line, but the group is now starting to meet in person again.

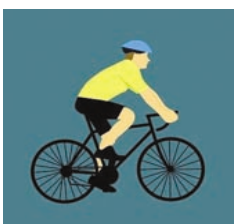

Pedalling News



Disley and Newtown cyclists are being warned by our local Policing Team of a recent increase in cycle thefts. To combat this, Disley Parish Council and PCSO Rob Evans are due to carry out a free bike-marking session soon. Official bike marking not only acts as a deterrent, but it is also a useful method for returning stolen bikes to their rightful owners. The session will be advertised on the Parish Council's notice boards, website and social media shortly.

The Parish Council is also currently pursuing a number of local cycling initiatives with Cheshire East Council. These include replacement gates, improvements to surfaces and markings for the establishment of a proper cycle route between Disley and Poynton through Lyme Park. A cycle route parallel to the A6 to give a safe cycle lane in both directions and connect up with the A555 cycle path is also being pursued. The Council is asking local cyclists to support these initiatives to help demonstrate local backing for improved cycle provisions in Disley and Newtown. Disley Community Bus has been operating a reduced service during the past 12 months with only essential shopping trips being made within the confines of the Coronavirus restrictions.

The popular and varied programme of social trips had to be put on hold but Disley Parish Council are pleased to be able to cautiously restart a small number of trips to local garden centres during August.

As things start to get back to normal, the intention is to increase the number and variety of trips available over the next few months.

Passengers currently have plenty of space in the 14-seater bus as trips are restricted to 8 passengers for social distancing purposes and precautionary measures including use of face coverings and hand sanitiser will remain in place for the time being.

This autumn, Disley Library is delighted to be returning to its usual opening hours of:

- Tuesday 9am - 1pm
- Wednesday 9am - 1pm
- Thursday 2pm - 6pm
- Friday 2pm - 6pm
- Saturday 9am - 1pm

Staff are asking visitors to bring their library card so that books can be returned, renewed and issued through the self-service machine. Books can still be renewed or reserved online, and the reservation limit has increased to 10 items per borrower.

Library members can use the computers for free for an hour per day, which gives access to Ancestry, Which reports, Driving Theory Test practice, online newspapers and much more. Library e-resources have a fantastic selection of magazines available through the Libby App, as well as all the audio books and e-books available through Borrowbox. If you would like any further information, the friendly library staff will be happy to help.

More good news is that Baby Bounce and Rhymetime sessions have restarted at Disley Library. The sessions are free and there is no need to book. Baby Bounce runs on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings from 10.00am to 10.30am and is aimed at babies, under-1's and those not yet walking, and their parents or carers. Rhymetime takes place on Thursday afternoons from 2.15pm to 2.45pm and is open to all pre-school aged children with their parents or carers. The sessions are a relaxed and fun mix of songs and rhymes.

That's what 'Friends' are for



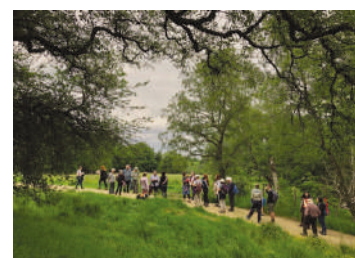

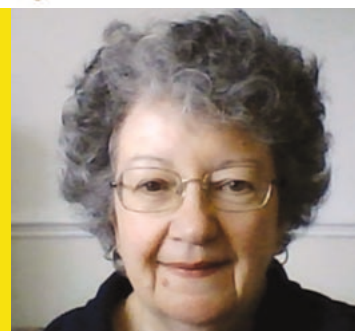

Meet your Councillors

- Cllr. Jean Windsor



Disley Parish Council is keen for residents to get to know a bit more about their local Parish Councillors and what motivates them. Parish Councillors are elected every four years to represent the views of all sections of the community. They are expected to act in a fair, honest and selfless manner and do not receive any payment for their time. Cllr. Jean Windsor was elected as a Parish Councillor in May 2019. She is involved in the Parish Council's Community Transport Scheme, Streetscene, Village Events and Village Health and Wellbeing project teams. She is also the Treasurer and Secretary of the Friends of Disley Station (FODS).

What did you/do you do for a living?

All my working life I worked in the City of London in the financial services industry, the last 28 years for a Canadian Investment Bank and I specialised in Portfolio Valuations.

Do you have a family, pets etc.?

I bought my house in Newtown, Disley in 2005 whilst I was still working in London and moved there full time in 2012 upon retirement. I moved to Disley in 2014 where I now live with my partner, Simon, and my cat (also called Simon).

What are your hobbies and interests?

If you could change one thing about the village, what would it be?

I wish the A6 didn't run through the centre of the village and I would like to see better provision of public transport to encourage more people to use it.



Middlewood Partnership - You've been framed!



The Middlewood Partnership, which includes the Schoolhouse Surgery, has launched a new video to explain how patients are benefiting from the merger of four practices in Bollington, Disley and Poynton.

The video, called 'General Practice Redefined,' explains how improvements such as a multi-disciplinary health team, closer working with local community and a strong focus on personalised care are benefitting patients.

"The decision to merge was our opportunity to make some big changes to improve quality and safety of care and to make our services easier for patients to access" said Paul Bowen, GP Partner and Middlewood Medical Director.

"It's now much easier for our team to work more closely together and makes patient care more cohesive and joined-up."

All requests from patients, carers and professionals now come into Middlewood via a single digital system - around 900 requests a day and ninety percent are dealt with on the same day.

Middlewood's merger paved the way for other new initiatives such as a home visiting service, the establishment of community virtual wards, the appointment of new clinical roles, a dedicated musculoskeletal (MSK) service and different appointment times and types in long-term conditions clinics.

Wildflowers on the verge



Since 1960, Cheshire has lost 99% of its wildflower meadows and the Cheshire Wildlife Trust is asking for everyone's help to create more space for them. One of the best places for wildflowers to thrive is on roadside verges, so the Trust has launched a road verge citizen science project to find out what condition Cheshire's verges are in.

To take part, safely photograph a section of a road verge anywhere in Cheshire and send it in to the Wildlife Trust stating its location. Experts will then use the photos to identify suitable verges to plant wildflowers and protect those which are vital for wildlife. Photos and locations should be sent to:

Lyme and water: River Restoration Project



Prior to 2020, National Trust at Lyme had been working with partners to establish ways of restoring and maintaining healthy river catchments, both within and beyond the National Trust's walls.

This exciting work is now continuing through Lyme's Riverlands Project; a series of catchment restoration schemes to improve water quality, flow conditions and wildlife habitats. The NT are aiming to ensure their water quality is the best it can be for nature to thrive, from tiny invertebrates to mammals and birds.

From early autumn 2021, there will be some changes around Lyme from the creation of 'leaky dams', removal of invasive species and the formation of wetlands. Our volunteers will be regularly monitoring water quality and will be trained in 'riverfly' and water chemistry sampling. The photograph shows Coal Pit Clough, where there are native woodland and stream restoration plans for Autumn 2021.

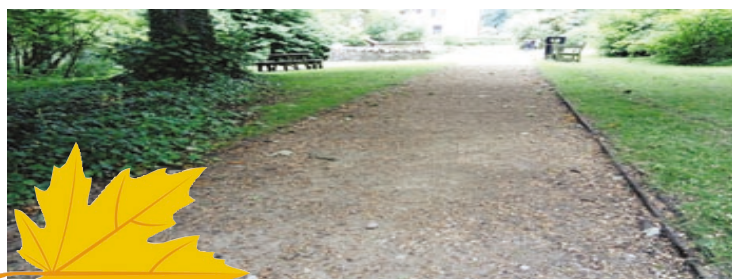
Disley Rangers bench ventures

Disley Parish Council's Rangers are continuing to spruce up the village. Everywhere you look in Disley and Newtown the Rangers have been out with their paint brushes, trimmers, shovels and brooms.

A number of benches have received a much-needed makeover, the path in the Memorial Park is fit for purpose again and all the play equipment in the Newtown Play Area has been painted up ready for its new surfacing.

These are just a few examples of the Ranger's handywork outside the day-to-day tasks of keeping the village clean and safe for all.

Toddbrook Reservoir Whaley Bridge Dam repairs



The Canal & River Trust (CRT) are currently working on a major project to restore Toddbrook Reservoir after the dam auxiliary spillway was damaged in August 2019. CRT recently undertook a public consultation into the repair plan and held drop-in events in Whaley Bridge. CRT hope to start work on site in winter 2021, with the project taking approximately two years to complete.

Disley residents have expressed concerns about possible disruption from construction vehicles accessing the site, particularly on Buxton Old Road. The Parish Council has raised these concerns directly with CRT and have been assured that the planning application will include a detailed Traffic Management Plan and will take resident feedback into account. The Traffic Management Plan will include the routing of construction vehicles and estimated volumes of traffic and will be available to the public.

The feasibility of getting construction vehicles underneath the railway bridge in Whaley Bridge, which would allow CRT to use the A6 as a preferred route, is currently under review.

Disley Parish Council will remain in close contact with CRT and will update residents via its website www.disleyparishcouncil.org.uk and regular eBulletins.
