A message from the Chair

As we start to return to normal after two extremely difficult years, Disley Parish Council is extremely busy working for, and with, our community. I would like to thank Parish Council staff for all their hard work supporting our community. I know that their efforts are much appreciated by residents and councillors.

In early April, just in time for the Easter holidays, new equipment was installed at the Arnold Rhodes Play Area. The new timber trail looks great. A similar trail is being installed at the Dane Hill Close Play Area, funded by a successful crowdfunding campaign organised by the Friends of Dane Hill Close Park. Thank you to all the residents and businesses who helped to make this possible.

The Parish Council is currently developing an environmental improvement scheme for its green open space at Newtown Playing Fields. This will include a nature trail, tree planting scheme and planned land management to increase biodiversity. The Friends of Disley Station recently received the Best Kept Garden Award at the 2021 Cheshire Best Kept Station awards evening. Thank you to all the volunteers who have helped Disley win this award, and to everyone who donated plants. If you haven't visited the station recently, it is well worth a look. While you are there, you will notice some major improvements to the start of the Gritstone Trail footpath. This has been done as a joint venture between Parish Council Rangers, the Friends of Disley Station and Disley Footpaths Society. The Parish Council is continuing with a programme of improvements and re-decoration at Disley Community Centre. Work must take place around the high level of bookings to try and minimise disruption to users. Disley Community Bus trips are proving extremely popular as people can get out and about and enjoy life once again. There is a summer of activity to look forward to in Disley & Newtown with many events planned to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, a new Community Showcase event and the welcome return of the Disley Show. On behalf of councillors and staff, may I wish you all a very enjoyable summer.



Bus back buzzin' about

Disley Community Bus has been out and about providing its regular service of weekly shopping trips and an increased number and variety of social trips. Passengers have recently enjoyed trips to Southport, West Kirby, Bakewell and Wentworth Garden Centre near Rotherham and are looking forward to future outings to Llangollen, St. Annes on Sea and, of course, the ever-popular Bury Market.

In addition, the monthly lunch trips have re-started with residents appreciating the camaraderie of a communal lunch at The Joshua Bradley in Hyde and Platform One in Romiley. The bus is now carrying up to 12 passengers per trip in the 14-seater bus although, recognising that the coronavirus is still active, the Parish Council is asking all passengers and drivers to wear a face covering on the bus, unless they are medically exempt.

There is a fantastic team of dedicated volunteer drivers who give their time to drive the bus and their commitment is much appreciated by the Parish Council and all passengers. Without them, the scheme simply could not run.

Drake Carr Cottage, off Mudhurst Lane in Higher Disley, is opening its garden for charity as part of the National Garden Scheme.

Featured as an "inspirational garden"in Alan Titchmarsh's "Love Your Garden" series, Drake Carr Cottage's half an acre cottagestyle garden sits in a beautiful rural setting with a natural stream running into a large wildlife pond.

The garden features many native species and surrounds a beautiful 17th Century stone cottage. The garden contains trees, shrubs, herbaceous borders, wild-flower meadow and a vegetable plot, and is set on several levels, divided by grassed areas, slopes and steps. This blends into a boarded walkway through a bog garden, continuing to a mature wooded area.

Drake Carr Cottage Garden will be open on Saturday and Sunday 11th and 12th June from 11.00am to 5.00pm.

Teas and cakes (including glutenfree) will be available.

Entry is £5 for adults and children under 12 free with proceeds being donated to charity.

Regular children's activities at Disley Library include Baby Bounce, Rhymetime, Storytime and Lego Club.


The library's Ancestry sessions are back up and running, so book a session with one of the volunteers for £3.00 per session and start researching your family tree.

We have all benefited from her dedication, professionalism and expert clinical acumen over the years and it will understandably take time for everyone to adjust. However, just as when previous partners moved onto pastures new, the wheels of General Practice will continue to turn.

Back in the 1980s about 85% of consultations were delivered by GPs - that figure across the country is now around 45%, with a growing range of new primary care healthcare colleagues managing this remainder. As has been well publicised there is a national shortage of GPs - the much-touted promise of an extra 6000 GPs by 2025 will not be delivered and indeed there is currently less whole-time equivalent GPs working in England than there was when the pledge was made. This has led to posts being left unfilled for many years across the country and an often-intolerable strain on GP services. In Middlewood I am fortunate to have not only a full complement of excellent GP colleagues, but also a new wider workforce who are able to offer additional knowledge, skills and experience to bolster the primary care team. These new colleagues bring new expertise to patient care into the community and is something that benefits us all. Having said that, there will always be a critical role for GPs, and more like 60% of consultations are delivered by these doctors within Middlewood. We are constantly striving to find the right balance of clinicians across our patch and are fortunate to be able to have choices of colleagues rather than having to make do or take whatever is available. We all know that we can't replace the exact experience, local knowledge and expertise of Dr Bainbridge, and just like Drs Boyle, Edwards and Maxwell, this will be missed by the community. However, being part of a robust and sustainable wider partnership means we are able to provide additional regular GPs in Disley who I know you will welcome and support. This, combined with the infrastructure to support a range of new services across the whole Partnership, makes for a positive future."

A Splash of Lyme





The National Trust at Lyme is pleased to announce that their Summer Opening Hours are back. So, visitors can take advantage of the light nights and sunny days as the park now closes at 8.00pm. It's also free to enter after 4.30pm.

Lyme is also pleased to welcome visitors back into the house. When architects, Leoni and Wyatt, designed Lyme, they created several historic viewpoints throughout the estate.


There will be a new exhibition in the Summer highlighting the history of Lyme and its landscape. The exhibition will include interpretations of the landscape from the collection, including a recently restored painting of Lyme that has never been displayed before.

As Covid restrictions have eased, behind the scenes tours of the house have returned, including Butler Truelove's pantry downstairs at Lyme. The "What's On" section of the website has more details of this and the range of self-led and guided walks and tours.

Families will be excited to hear that the first phase of the new Crow Wood has finished and that the play area is now open. Sadly, due to Covid, many of the projects at Lyme had to be paused but, since work restarted in November, well-needed surface and drainage work has been undertaken. The play area now has more equipment for explorers of all ages and Lyme is looking for feedback to help them shape further developments. As always there will be plenty of family activities at Lyme over the summer holidays.

In the wider parkland, the Green Recovery Project, with funding from Green Recovery and support from players of People's Postcode Lottery, is coming to an end. The project aims to slow the flow of water across Lyme to help improve water quality across the site as well as help prevent climate change by trapping carbon in the soil. An added benefit for those who live downstream from Lyme is that it will also help with flood mitigation, slowing the water from heavy rains converging in the watercourse at the same time. As part of this work, the ranger team have improved over 1,617 meters of watercourses by installing over 100 leaky dams and 22 scrapes across Lyme.

NECCP distribute funding to community and voluntary groups, and groups of volunteers, across Adlington, Bollington, Disley, Kettleshulme, Mottram St Andrew, Pott Shrigley, Poynton, Prestbury and Rainow. The group looks to invest in new initiatives or ideas which support the work of voluntary and community groups which already exist.

In 2022, speakers have so far, covered topics such as "Manchester Blood Bikes" "Life of a Chelsea Pensioner" and "Experiences Fundraising for St Anne's Hospice". This year, more social evenings are planned, including various activities instead of speakers. 

Local groups have been learning how to spot, avoid and report fraud, thanks to Age UK Cheshire East's Scams Awareness & Aftercare Project.

Project Manager, Sally Wilson, said, "Every 40 seconds an older person becomes a victim of fraud.
