As our thoughts turn towards Christmas and New Year festivities, I would like to briefly look back on a very busy summer for Disley Parish Council.

In June, Disley and Newtown residents enjoyed four days of celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee with a variety of events organised within our community. The weather was kind, except on the day of the Parish Council's Jubilee Picnic. Not to be deterred, a very enjoyable indoor picnic went ahead, and I would like to thank everyone who attended.

In July, we held a brand new event, the Disley Community Showcase. This focussed on the many community groups and activities in Disley and Newtown. The event highlighted the work of our many community volunteers and provided an opportunity for attendees to get involved and try something new.

In August, we were pleased to see the return of the Disley & Lyme Horticultural Society Show after an absence of two years, and the Disley Community Bus was used to provide transport from Disley village centre to the show.

The Parish Council is continuing with a programme of improvements to the Community Centre over the coming months. Work will take place around the very high level of bookings to minimise disruption to users.

We are continuing to work with the Schoolhouse Surgery and Middlewood Partnership to support improved communication with residents and to promote the health and wellbeing of our community. The recent 'Know Your Numbers' blood pressure and ECG checks carried out by trained community volunteers have proved very popular. Thank you to everyone involved with these events. In August, the Parish Council arranged two sessions of community defibrillator and CPR training. These sessions were well-attended and the training is due to be repeated in Spring 2023.

As I write, we are finalising our plans for the Civic Service and Remembrance Sunday and plans for the Disley Parish Council Christmas Extravaganza are also well under way.

I would like to thank Parish Council staff for all their hard work supporting our community. I know that their efforts are much appreciated by residents and councillors.

Disley Library's catalogue of events



There are some lovely events coming to Disley Library over the festive period, as shown on the accompanying posters below.

The library will be open throughout December at the usual hours but will be closed on Christmas Eve 24th December, Monday 26th December, Tuesday 27th December, New Year's Eve 31st December and Monday 2nd January 2023.

Once the festivities are over, why not pop into the library for their popular Jigsaw January with puzzles for both adults and children.

The Junior Library has recently had a lovely new refurbishment and for younger members, there is a range of activities every week with Baby Bounce, Rhymetime and Lego Club as well as a monthly Stories and Songs session and Kids Craft Club. For adults, the monthly Keen Cooks Book Group is held on the first Friday of every month, 2pm-3pm, where the group discover a new recipe book to talk about (and taste the results) and discuss what they have been cooking that month. It's the tastiest book group in Disley, so why not go along and join in the fun, sharing a cuppa with friendly faces. The library also offers free IT Buddy sessions, so whether you are a complete beginner, or need some support with a specific problem, there are friendly volunteers on hand to help. Visitors can use their own computers or get help with smartphones, laptops or iPads.

If you love books, but find it difficult to access the library, there is also have a free Home Library Service, run by staff and volunteers.

Stamp out scammers!

Cheshire East age UK

Last year in Cheshire, 5,281 people reported being scammed, costing them over £20 million in total. Scammers are criminals who commit fraud, and they target older people more than any other group.

Scammers often work in teams and target the same person with several different scams. The scam might be a phone call, text, email, letter, or someone knocking on your front door.

Age UK Cheshire East work with Trading Standards and Cheshire Police to tell people about the latest scams and support you.

The best way to protect yourself is to have a personal advice session, tailored to suit you.

As part of a national project, Age UK are working with Lloyds Bank to deliver sessions to help older people protect themselves. The sessions are free and can take place in your home, online over Zoom, or in your local community centre or library.

'I was lucky enough to grow up in Disley during the Nineties and Noughties and the village holds many precious memories for me. The local shops have always been the beating heart of Disley. Does anybody else remember the flower shop, with its seemingly infinite wall of TY Beanie Babies?" I fondly recall standing on tiptoes, craning my neck, taking ages to pick my Friday night treat after school. The Cat Sanctuary charity shop was like my own personal paradise. Upstairs was entirely dedicated to books.

I'd kneel on the floor for hours, sifting through pages of the Famous Five and Malory Towers, inhaling the unrivalled scent of old books. We've never been short of eateries and tasty treats either, from an obligatory roast dinner at the Ram's Head after a Sunday hike in Lyme Park, to Yvonne's legendary homemade chocolate chip cookies at the bakery.

And as a 10-year-old in the early 2000's, there was nothing more exciting than being invited to a birthday party at Conti (now Sasso). Being allowed to make my own pizza - with unlimited mozzarella - was an awesome novelty!

The delicatessen made the most mouth-watering paninis. My favourite was the 'Christmas panini,' which I shamelessly enjoyed all year round. Packed with sausage, turkey, cranberry and stuffing, it was an absolute taste sensation.

A 'penny mix' from Graham's sweet shop, or a handful of free grapes from lovely Anne at the greengrocers also takes me right back to Disley days gone by. The row of shops might have changed many times over the years, but Disley has succeeded in retaining its unrivalled charm and unique community spirit. This is what makes Disley still feel like 'home,' despite the miles now between us.' 



"Like so many of us as we get older, I find myself thinking that things in general are 'not as good as they used to be.' Perhaps such thoughts are inevitable when we look back fondly on experiences, events, and services, and compare them to a current travail. 
Community Bus 'buzzin' about!
