A report from **Cheshire East** Councillor, Sue Adams

Cllr Adams writes:

"I would like to thank all residents of Disley and Newtown for the tremendous community support I have received since being elected. It has been a steep learning curve, frustrating at times, but I am starting to get some results for residents. There are two aspects to my role. Firstly, I deal with casework for residents, doing my best to resolve matters raised. My caseload is very varied but includes, in my opinion, far too many highways issues. I get some problems resolved within a few days and others take much longer. Things usually don't happen as fast as I would like, but with the right contacts, I have been delighted to get several problems resolved within a few hours.

Secondly, I am one of 82 Cheshire East councillors. I serve on Adults and Health, Audit and Governance and Scrutiny committees.

The role of Cheshire East Councillor is challenging, though my experience as a parish councillor and as a qualified accountant have enabled me to rapidly get to grips with my new role. I am pleased to also be continuing as a Disley Parish Councillor and as the lead councillor on the Health and Wellbeing and Community Bus project groups."



No scams here

Air quality in Disley



Cheshire East Council Environmental Health are reporting that air quality in Disley is showing a gradual improvement, in correlation to what is being seen across Cheshire East.

There are currently 12 Air Quality Management Areas (AQMA) within Cheshire East which are all related to traffic, and one of these is along Market Street in Disley. Air quality is monitored using diffusion tubes which are changed and analysed monthly. There are 9 tubes located within Disley and the raw monthly data from these tubes can be seen on the Cheshire East website by searching for: "Air pollution monitoring."

The map attached shows the location of the diffusion tubes (green dots) and red line boundary of the AQMA in Disley.

Cheshire East also operates one Real Time Analyser (RTA) which is located on Market Street and monitors Nitrogen Dioxide (NO2) and Particulate Matter (PM10 and PM2.5). Quarterly data is sent through to the Parish Council for information.

Cheshire East has an Air Quality Action Plan, which details general and specific measures with the aim of improving air quality. The current Action Plan is for 2020-2025 and can be found on the Cheshire East website by searching for: "Air Quality Action Plan."

Cheshire East has launched its "Show the Air you Care" awareness campaign and has recently targeted vehicle idling and domestic solid fuel burning. A downloadable Schools Anti Idling Booklet to champion no idling at schools has also been produced and is available for free on the website.

Finally, an education package has been produced for delivery in schools to raise awareness within Key Stage 2 (KS2), specifically years 5 and 6. The lesson is around 45 minutes and links into the National Curriculum. The aim of the education package is to educate children about air pollution and the effects it can have on health.

Disley Arts Society's 50th Anniversary



In 1973, a group of people in Disley decided to start a club for the 'promotion of painting and sketching' and soon this became more organised as the Disley Arts Society. Meetings started in October 1973 at the Ring O' Bells Quaker Meeting House and were planned to be fortnightly but soon changed to

The first Annual Exhibition was held at the Ring O' Bells on 27th April 1974 but in 1977 it moved to St. Mary's Schoolroom and since then has been held in the Ram's Head, the Methodist Church and is now at the Village Hall in High Lane. Art was also displayed in the Ploughboy, Disley Library and New Mills Heritage Centre for several years.

Demonstrations are given several times a year by professional artists who have included Geoff Kersey and local watercolourist Matthew Goddard. A member recalls:

"When I decided to work part-time, I joined Disley Arts Society over 25 years ago. One of our best artists was Wyn Hyde who painted loose watercolour landscapes and sold nearly every one. After she died, we implemented a 'People's Choice' at the exhibition, where people could vote for their favourite painting. The artist was awarded the Wyn Hyde Award and had the dubious honour of producing a painting to be raffled at the following exhibition. Another lady member, who had been a complete beginner, sadly passed away and her husband wanted to encourage those members who were also beginners. He donated a crystal bowl to be presented to the person who had made the most progress in the year."

As in the beginning, today's society members have a wide range of abilities and genres and meetings are still held every Monday morning, except Bank Holidays, from 9.00am until noon. You've got a Friend!





Monika Sayed, the Station Manager, provided an excellent popup poster which will now be used for future occasions, so will become a regular at FODS events at the Community Centre.




Postcard from Local History Society


A fitting floral memorial

Health matters in Disley

Dr. Maurice from the Schoolhouse Surgery has kindly provided an update: "So, we have a new ramp at The Schoolhouse front door and the new lowered counter at reception - both designed to improve access in the Surgery. The irony will not be lost on many of you, at a time when access to healthcare in this country is as challenging as I've ever known it.

Waiting lists for hospital appointments are now often measured in years rather than weeks, and the wait for an emergency bed can take days rather than hours. I share everyone's distress and also the sense of powerlessness to influence the situation. In particular, the knock on effects on General Practice are incredibly frustrating for us all. General Practice is providing a third more appointments than before the pandemic, but it is still not enough. The waits for appointments at the Surgery concern us all - without a significant change in priority and resources given to healthcare, very little will change.

In the meantime, I hope the ramp and the lowered desk prove helpful, and perhaps serve as a reminder that little things are all we can manage at present. Perhaps the new year will bring greater improvements to access for us all."

St Mary's 500 - the next century and beyond



This set out the future challenges St Mary's faces on its sustainability on day to day running costs; grounds and graveyard maintenance; restoration and maintenance of its ancient structure. Church income is totally reliant on giving from the congregation, donations, fundraising and grants. The church will continue to seek the views of the community to inform how it can serve the community for the next century and beyond.

The oldest part of the church, the Tower, is 500 years old next year and its restoration presents another fund-raising challenge. A Phase 1 Restoration Appeal has been launched to raise £200,000 for the restoration of the Tower and West End elevations. After this, a Phase 2 Appeal will be needed to address restoration of the remainder of the church structure.

Disley Parish Council has been working hard over the past 12 months to improve the facilities available to residents at the Newtown Playing Fields. The Playing Fields are a bit of a hidden gem, tucked away behind the A6 in Newtown. The only indication is a discrete sign opposite the entrance to Peveril Gardens.

A new changing room facility has been installed, vastly improving both the look of the site and the amenities for, league-winning, Disley Football Club. The landscaping around the playground has been opened up to make it more welcoming and the area has been re-turfed for a more natural feel.

The Disley Rangers have installed a new picnic bench, cycle racks and rubbish bin to help modernise the play area. Many of the overgrown fields surrounding the football pitch have been cut back recently, as part of an on-going commitment to improve the biodiversity of the area.

The new benches installed last year in the top field offer fantastic views over the Goyt Valley to Hague Bar, New Mills and beyond. It is hoped to undertake some sympathetic tree planting in this area shortly, to reintroduce more native species.


