What's on at the library?

This Summer, Disley Library will be running the popular Summer Reading Challenge 2024 both in the library and online too. This year's theme is Marvellous Makers, celebrating children's creativity, supported by the Reading Agency.

Regular children's activities at Disley Library include Baby Bounce, Rhymetime, Stories and Songs, Kid's Craft Club and Lego Club.

For adults, there is the monthly Keen Cooks Book Group on the first Friday of every month, 2-3pm, and the Home Library Service for borrowers that are unable to come into the library. Everyone is also welcome to drop in for a cuppa and chat in the library on Saturday mornings starting from 27th July and throughout August, from 10am to 12noon. They even have jigsaws!

Joining the library is free for adults and children. Just take proof of your name and address to get your free library card. Membership allows you to borrow up to 20 books and gives you one hour free per day on the computers. The library card also entitles you to access free online resources including BorrowBox for audiobooks and ebooks and Libby for magazines. On the library computers you can access Ancestry, Find My Past, Driving Theory Test Pro and Which? all for free. There are supported Ancestry sessions available to book for only £3, and you can book time with an IT Buddy for free basic computer skills support.

The EOLP Public Health Team also recently educated volunteers in Disley to run a bereavement support programme. The 6 week self-help programme benefits anyone affected by bereavement and can be accessed through the GP or social prescriber at Schoolhouse Surgery. The next programme in Disley will commence in June/July 2024.

EOLP also supported Disley Parish Council to establish the Disley Friends Social Group. Disley Friends is a social gettogether for people with memory difficulties, carers and people who live alone that would like to socialise. It offers music and singing and a chance to have a chat, make new friends, drink tea and eat cake. The group will be meeting at 1:30pm - 3:30pm at Disley Community Centre on 10th May, 14th June, 12th July, 9th August, 13th September, 11th October, 8th November and 13th December 2024.

A Disley Parish Council Community Grant has enabled EOLP to create a Namaste Resource Box/Basket for Disley Friends. This resource addresses an individual's physical, emotional and spiritual needs and aims to care for those living with dementia in the community. It creates a quiet, peaceful environment to motivate family carers, raising self-esteem to help them to care for longer. The Namaste Resource Box/Basket will be available to borrow from the Disley Friends Social Group from June.

Sign up now for your flexible friend



A weekly Flexilink bus service started operating in Disley in March and has been very well received. The bus goes to Handforth Dean one week and Poynton the next week on Tuesday mornings. Disley Parish Council collaborated with Cheshire East/Ansa to introduce this service which is available to all Disley and Newtown residents regardless of age, mobility or access to a car. This is because Disley has no available public transport to get residents to these destinations within Cheshire East.

The bus departs from Disley Community Centre at 10am, returning to Disley by 2pm. Passengers can also arrange to be picked up from Peveril Gardens in Newtown and at the bus stop on the A6 by Disley Methodist Church. The bus is free to holders of Cheshire East bus passes or £3 each way for everyone else. To use the service, passengers can either register online (just search for 'Ansa Flexilink') or complete a form available from Disley Parish Council or Disley

Once registered, passengers book a seat by calling 0300 123 5110 (Mon-Fri 10am -1pm). Regular bookings can also be made.

Feedback from passengers has been extremely positive and residents are encouraged to register for this service to ensure that it remains in place. It really is a case of 'use it or lose it.'

Garden gate opens for charity at Drake Carr Cottage



Drake Carr Cottage, off Mudhurst Lane, in Higher Disley is opening its garden for the National Garden Scheme again this year. The owners of Drake Carr would like to say a massive thank you to everyone who came last year and helped to raise a total of over £2,200 for charity.

Featured in 'Love Your Garden' on TV and in various magazines, the garden contains a wide variety of trees, shrubs and herbaceous plants, surrounding a 17th century stone cottage. A natural stream flows through the garden, opening into a large wildlife pond and continuing through a bog garden into a mature wooded area. The stream-side walk, vegetable plot and wildflower meadow add to the variety of habitats for many species of birds, small mammals and insects. Fantastic FODS



The Friends of Disley Station (FODS) are delighted to announce that they won an award for the third year running from Cheshire Best Kept Stations in the Sustainability category. The group feared they had jinxed their chances earlier in the year, by saying it would be good to achieve a hat trick.

FODS continue their aim to use wildlife-friendly plants on the slope and large containers at the station. The group also replaced the seed mats at the station entrance with perennial plants which are all thriving.

The long wooden planters on the platforms are too small for perennial plants, so have bedding plants watered from the water butts.

FODS have been donated an enormous metre-square planter by Transport for Greater Manchester (TFGM) which contains Agastache, which the bees adore, and which complements the Jerusalem sage.

The main slope is looking excellent with a mixture of perennial plants and wildflowers and now has 10kg of daffodil bulbs which will be allowed to naturalise.

Visit the station soon to see what projects will be in place next from the wonderful FODS team.

There were few calls for visits or odd jobs, so transport became the sole purpose, and remains so.

Requests for help are received by the scheme manager, who contacts the drivers until a match is found. Passengers are asked to make a voluntary donation, just to help fund the cost of the driver's fuel. There is currently a pool of 17 drivers, with requests posted to the secure WhatsApp group and passenger details passed on securely to the driver.

Good Neighbours is supported by donations from passengers and occasionally donations from the Parish Council, Probus or other local bodies. They also hold coffee mornings in the Community Centre, to raise funds and promote the service. The service is for those who live in the political parish of Disley and have no transport to get to their appointment. This could be to hospitals, doctors, hairdressers, opticians, podiatrists etc but not for shopping.

Good Neighbours have hosted a Christmas lunch for passengers and drivers to meet and also social gatherings for the drivers, as shown in the photo.

With no public transport available to health services such as New Mills clinics, Macclesfield Hospital, Poynton and Bollington clinics, the Good Neighbours service would have needed to be invented.

Good Neighbours now has a dedicated mobile phone, with a message facility and passengers are asked to leave their name and number along with the date, time and destination. The more notice provided, the better, although they always try to accommodate all requests.

Anyone Who Had a Heart



Disley's Heart Heroes are a small team of volunteers who were trained by the Innovation Agency (NHS Academic Health Service Network). They attend events in Bollington, Disley and Poynton to support the community's health by checking blood pressures and pulse rates. The team can then provide information on what the readings mean and where to go for help, if needed. The Heart Heroes aim to raise awareness of heart health but cannot give medical advice. However, they may refer people to the local pharmacist or their GP if it would be beneficial. The next event that the Heart Heroes will be attending in Disley is the Community Defibrillator and CPR training session on June 20th at the Community Centre. (See the poster elsewhere in the Disley News for details). Heart checks will be available even if you are not attending the training.

Health matters in Disley



Dr Andrew Maurice from the Schoolhouse Surgery has kindly provided an update:

"As I write, more grey clouds have brought another torrential downpour. We seem to have endured lots of rainy days and very little sunshine this Spring. However, we all know there isn't anything we can do about inclement weather in the short term - other than make sure we are adequately protected from the deluge, in the knowledge that things will

improve in time. I'm starting to think the state of our beloved NHS is somewhat similar. We have all endured atrocious conditions in the last few years, and it is frustrating that as individuals it often feels our influence is limited. The changes we have implemented to General Practice locally and across Middlewood have afforded us all some degree of protection from the incessant cuts to healthcare resources -. who knows how much worse things would have been? That said, many of us have been around long enough to know things will improve in time - the NHS has to be allowed to perform at its best again. In the meantime, here at Schoolhouse Surgery we will continue offer whatever shelter we can and trust that you will be engaging in some healthy habits now the better weather

has (hopefully!) arrived."

Lyme **Parking**



Work to improve the infrastructure at Lyme includes developing access to the property, however you choose to visit. One focus is looking at how cars visit the estate with the goal of reducing queues backing onto the A6 and the impact this has on neighbours on busy days.

This year Lyme is running tests to see the impact if visitors were to Pay-on-Exit on certain days. So far, there have been three test days across various days of the week and initial results have shown less cars idling at the Admissions Hut and a reduction in wait times to enter. Lyme has been asking for visitor feedback on the scheme on these days via social media, and to date, there has been positive feedback from over 100 responses.

However, NT Lyme still faces challenges around car park capacity and in poor weather, only around half of the available spaces are usable. Lyme is encouraging visitors to help with this issue by travelling on public transport or by bike. As a 'thank you' they are offering 10% off refreshment orders in any of the onsite cafes to visitors who arrive by these modes of transport.



Shared Lives carers required in Disley



Clocks away!



Disley Parish Council has recently appointed a specialist clock repair company to undertake repairs and improvements to the turret clock at St. Mary's Church in Disley.

The Disley Rural District Council, as it was at the time, introduced the current clock into the tower in 1956, to replace the original 1830 clock. The new clock movement was manufactured by William Potts & Sons of Leeds and the exterior dial is 6-foot in diameter.

The barrel has been taken away so that a new pivot can be manufactured and installed, leaving the clock temporarily out of operation. The winding mechanism also requires some attention to make it safe, but this work will be carried out on site.

It is hoped that the clock will be keeping time for the village again before the end of the Summer.





SEN families in Disley



A Disley SEN (Special Education Needs) Parent and Carer support group has been set up on Facebook by parents. Members have children with a range of challenges, neurodiversity being the most common but also mental health and physical disabilities.










Newtown Defibrillator
